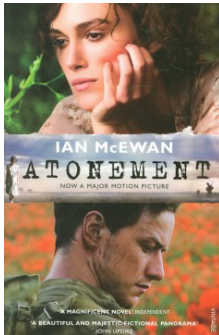

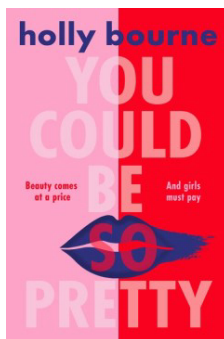


Atonement

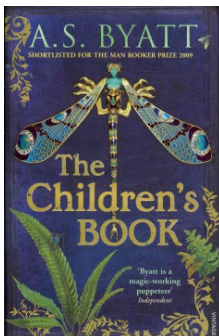


You could be so pretty

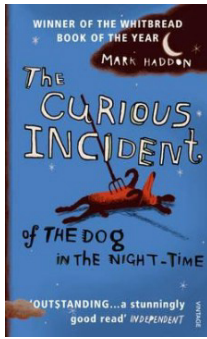


The children's book

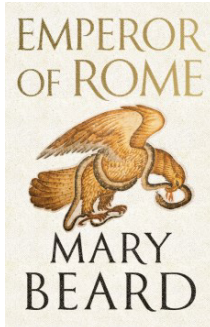


The curious incident of the dog in the night-time

A comprehensive history of the social and political world of the Roman emperors including Julius Caesar, Nero, Alexander Severus, Caligula and Marcus Aurelius.

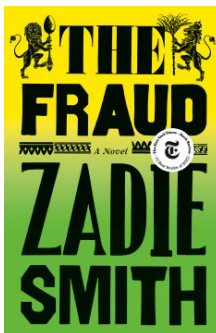

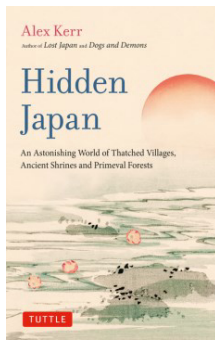


The fraud

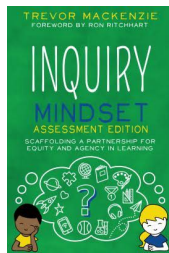

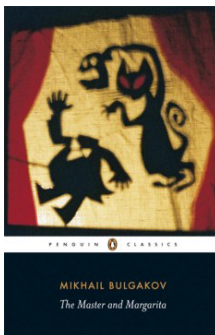

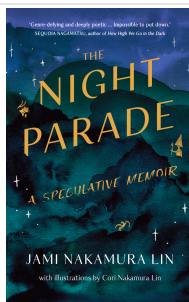


The master and Margarita

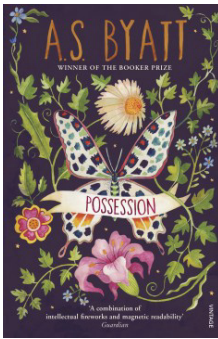


The night parade : a speculative memoir

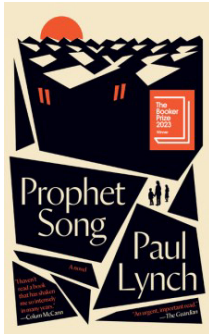

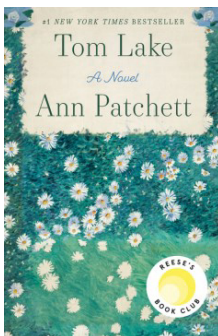


Prophet song
